As a horse-mad child growing up in Sydney, I finally got my first horse, a chestnut roan mare called Shandy. I later bred a couple of part Arabian foals from her including a chestnut roan filly, Canyon Cassandra. I started breeding Australian Ponies in 1978. I continued in a reduced way during our years farming in Goondiwindi and then after our move to Manilla. I became involved in the APSB North & Northwest Sub-Committee. With the purchase of the Welsh B stallion Bolagamy Thatcher, I started breeding Welsh ponies as well.

I am fortunate that my daughter Liz shares my interest and together we have expanded the stud and increased our success in the showring. We have bred a lovely chestnut roan filly, Canyon Wild Aster, who won Supreme Champion Welsh Pony at Sydney Royal this year. Her dam is the beautiful black roan mare, Keyi Wild Flower, who was also successfully shown as a filly. Wild Flower traces back to another black roan mare Eelah Wild Flower, who I was lucky to own in her last years. All our "Wild" ponies are bred from this bloodline. The roan numbers are slowly increasing!

I am lucky to be able to indulge my love of horses and enjoy being a part of the different Societies and groups, sharing a common interest and meeting many new friends.

Bred by Glynn Brodie in North Queensland, from performance horse lines. Biggs was originally trained by Harvey Wakefield, a specialist in Camp-draft and Challenge horses.

He then went on to become a junior girl's barrel racing horse. Biggs did very well for his junior riders at this and at breakaway roping as well.

I knew his owners at the time. They offered him to me as he wasn't going to make a competitive open rodeo horse. I originally said no, as I had just bought a nice Stockhorse mare for myself, however I ended up taking him as a babysitter for my horse.

After some time, I got Biggs back under saddle and he became my main riding horse. I eventually sold my Stockhorse mare.

It was a smooth transition from the rodeo arena to the show ring for Biggs. This was due to his temperament and kind nature. He is very reliable and happy to work, it's in his breeding.

In our first year of showing, at a limited number of shows, we went from winning his novice class to winning Champion Ridden Hack and Supreme horse of the show.

In 2022, our second year of showing, Biggs qualified in the Child's Hunter and in my Rider over 30 class. This was at the North QLD Horse of the Year Show in Mackay, which is a Grand National qualifier show.

At the end of 2022 I moved from Queensland to Goulburn, in NSW. It was here that we competed in our first Royal.

At the 2023 Canberra Royal Show, we placed in the Novice and Open Lady Rider classes. Then at the Roan National Show Biggs won Supreme Led Roan and Supreme Ridden Roan. The NSW Country Hack Championships, a Grand National qualifier show, at Tamworth were next. Here Biggs was Runner Up Preliminary Show Hunter, top 5 in the Child's Show Hunter and he took a child rider and me to the top 10 riders in our rider classes.

Biggs goes just as well around the show ring with either a child or adult rider on him. He doesn't need hours of work before his classes, a 10-minute warm up is enough. Biggs is such an easy-going horse, and very low maintenance. He prefers his paddock to a stable. And he doesn't wear shoes.



Being roan Biggs stands out in the show ring. He has a following too. People are interested to hear his story, from rodeo horse to show horse.
